1 February 1945: During the month of February, 1945, Motor Torpedo Boat Squadron TWELVE operated as an integral of Task Unit 70.1.3 under the command of Lieut. Murray Preston, USNR. Task Unit 70.1.3 in turn operated as a unit of Task Group 70.1, U. S. SEVENTH FLEET, under the command of Captain Selman S. Bowling, USN.

In accordance with Chief of Naval Operations dispatch of 16 January 1945 and CTG 70.1 dispatches of 10 and 11 February 1945, PT 127 with assigned officers and enlisted personnel was transferred to Motor Torpedo Boat Squadron TWELVE from Motor Torpedo Boat Squadron SEVEN as of 1600, 15 February 1945.

Base of operations for the month was from PT Advanced Base, Ormoc, Leyte, P. I. Patrol areas included the waters surrounding Cebu, the north west coast of Leyte and the Camotes Sea. Primary mission was the blockade of these waters to all enemy barge and ship traffic. Secondary assignment was to give coverage and operational assistance to U. S. Army units operating on Leyte and Camotes Islands. Contacts with guerillas of Cebu Area Command were also maintained and all possible aid extended to that command.

Following is a day by day account of patrols completed and results.

1/2 February PT 191 and PT 152 assigned patrol of north west Cebu coast. PT 191 suffered engine casualty and patrol was secured.

PT 195 and PT 150 patrolled east coast Cebu with negative results.

2/3 February PT 146 and PT 130(Ron 7) made daylight sweep north Cebu with F4U's of Marine Air Group 14 with negative results.

PT 194 and PT 191 patrolled Bohol Straits with negative results.

3/4 February PT 195 and PT 150 assigned patrol Bohol Straits. PT 195 suffered an engine casualty and patrol was secured.

PT 196 and PT 152 patrolled north west Cebu coast with negative results.

- 4/5 February PT 128(Ron 7) and PT 150 patrolled north west coast of Cebu. Daanbantayan was rocketed with good effect. Otherwise patrol was negative.
- 5/6 February PT 130(Ron 7) and PT 194 patrolled Bohol Straits area.

 Three (3) miles east of Tinian Anchorage, Cebu City an enemy lugger
 was detected by boats. Lugger and one (1) dory were sunk, four (4)
 POW's were taken and thirty-one (31) enemy were killed. PT 194
 captured three (3) of the POW's.

PT 191 and PT 146 patrolled north coast of Cebu with negative results.

- 6/7 February PT 196 and PT 152 patrolled Bohol Straits area with negative results.

- 8/9 February PT 191 and PT 150 patrolled Bohol Straits with negative results.
- 9/10 February PT 130(OTC, Ron 7) and PT 196 made daylight sweep of east Cebu with F4U's of Marine Air Group 14. Results negative.

PT 152 and PT 194 patrolled north coast of Cebu with negative results.

10/11 February PT 129 (OTC, Ron 7) underway for Palompon to serve as ready boat against expected Jap evacuation of North west Leyte Coast. Negative patrol.

PT 146 and PT 192 patrolled east coast of Cebu. At Catmon a native sailboat with canoe in tow containing six (6) Japs was discovered. Craft were destroyed and enemy killed.

PT 191 and PT 134(Ron 7) conducted patrol of north west coast of Leyte in anticipation of expected Jap evacuation. Patrol was negative.

11/12 February PT 196 and PT 150 patrolled east coast of Cebu. At Sogod Bay, two (2) type "A" barges were discovered underway. Both barges were sunk and numerous enemy personnel and supplies destroyed. While attempting to capture a prisoner, PT 150 had one man shot through the back by a Jap feigning injury in the water.

PT 152 and PT 130(Ron 7) made daylight reconnaisance of Pacijan Island, Camotes with Army observers aboard. Then proceeded to Pal-ompon to serve as ready boat for expected Jap evacuation.

PT 128(OTC Ron 7) and PT 194 patrolled from Cabgan Island to Villaba, north west Leyte coast to cut off anticipated Jap evacuation. Patrol negative.

12/13 February PT 191 and PT 192 patrolled Bohol Straits with negative results.

- 13/14 February PT 129(OTC, Ron 7) and PT 196 patrolled north Cebu coast with negative results.
- 14/15 February PT 192 and PT 150 patrolled Bohol Straits with negative results.
- 15/16 February PT 191 and PT 196 patrolled north Cebu with negative results.

- 18/19 February PT 196 and PT 190 carried out bombardment of Jap troop concentration in Sugar Central San Carlos, Negros in conjunction with guerilla attack. Shore fire knocked out and considerable damage caused to Jap emplacements.
- 19/20 February PT 151 and PT 194 patrolled north Cebu with negative results.
 - PT 195 and PT 150 patrolled Bohol Straits. At 0800 encountered one (1) enemy 90 foot lugger (type VA) off Cabilao Island. Lugger was driven on to reef and badly damaged by funfire. Later reconaissance revealed that lugger had been towed off reef. Accordingly credit for destruction of lugger is not claimed.
- 20/21 February PT 190 and PT 192 patrolled Bantayan area with negative results.
- 21/22 February PT 195 and PT 196 patrolled east coast of Cebu with negative results.

PT 151 and PT 194 patrolled Bohol Straits with negative results.

28 February/Ol March PTs 151, 152, 194, 195 completed strafing mission on Talisay, Cebu City in conjunction with guerilla attack. No return fire. Upon completion of strafing PTs 151 and 194 returned to base while PTs 152 and 195 patrolled Bohol Straits for remainder of night with negative results.

2/3 March

PT 151 and PT 152 on patrol of south Bohol Straits. At 1742 PT 152 had an engine casualty. Boats returned to base securing the patrol.



During the month of October 1945, Motor Torpedo Boat Squadron TWELVE, under the command of Lieutenant J. J. MC GLYNN, USNR, was an integral of Task Unit 93.4.60 commanded by Captain Selmar S. BOWLING, USN. Task Unit 93.4.60 in turn operated under Commander Philippine Sea Frontier.

From 1 October 1945 to 26 October 1945, Motor Torpedo Boat Squadron TWELVE was stationed at PT Boat Base SEVENTEEN, Samar, P. I. in the process of being decommissioned.
